BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF WORK TO BE PERFORMED

The proposed work generally consists of furnishing all labor, equipment materials and supervision for the paving of Vine Street in the City of Sodaville per Contract Documents.

Specifications and bid documents will be available on <u>March 8, 2021</u> at Sodaville City Hall located at 30723 Sodaville Rd. Sodaville, OR 97355 at no cost or viewed at http://www.sodaville.org. Copies of the standard provisions are available upon request and are made part of the final contract agreement.

To be considered for award the following conditions must be met:

- Bidders must prequalify in accordance with ORS 279C.430 and provisions of public contracting rules as adopted by the State of Oregon at least two days prior to the date of the bid opening.
- Bidders must be prequalified for the following work classes.

Construction Landscaping

Prequalification can be met by bidders submitting Oregon Department of Transportation prequalification or providing two (2) to three (3) examples of similar construction projects completed.

- The Bid proposal must be submitted on the prescribed form and shall contain a statement by the bidder that the bid complies with the provisions of ORS 279C.800 to 279C.870 and contain a statement as to whether the bidder is a resident bidder as defined in ORS 279A.120.
- The Contractor must be registered with the Oregon Construction Contractors Board and shall have the appropriate license necessary to perform the work under this bid, or the State Landscaping Contractors Board in order for his/her bid to be considered on construction contracts.
- The Bid Proposal must be accompanied by cash, cashier's check, certified check or bid bond payable to the City of Sodaville, Sodaville, Oregon in an amount not less than ten percent (10%) of the total bid amount.
- The CONTRACTOR shall, within two working hours of the date and time of the deadline when the bids are due to the CITY, submit to the CITY a disclosure of any first-tier subcontractors that will be furnishing labor or materials in connection with the public improvement and whose contract value is equal to or greater than:
- 1. Five percent of the total project bid or \$15,000, whichever is larger; or
- 2. \$350,000, regardless of the percentage of the total project bid.

The disclosure of the first-tier subcontractors shall include:

- 1. The name and address of each subcontractor;
- 2. The registration number assigned to the subcontractor the Oregon Construction Contractors Board if the subcontractor is required to have a certificate of registration issued by the board;

- 3. The category of work that each subcontractor will perform; and the amount of the contract of the subcontractor.

BIDDERS CHECKLIST

Bidders' attention is called to the following forms which must be executed in full as required:

- **BID FORM (S)** Each bidder shall complete the bid form(s). Prices must be shown in the spaces provided and must be expressed in both words and figures. Where conflict occurs, written or typed words shall prevail.
- **BID BOND:** This form is to be executed by bidder and bidder's Surety. The amount of cash, certified check, cashier's check, irrevocable letter of credit or Bid Bond shall not be less than 10% (ten percent) of the total Bid amount.
- **FIRST-TIER SUBCONTRACTOR DISCLOSURE FORM:** When the contract value is greater than \$100,000, this form must be submitted by the bid submission deadline or within two working hours of such submission deadline. If no subcontractors will be used, the bidder must indicate "NONE" on the disclosure form. Failure to submit this form will result in the bid becoming non-responsive and such bid will not be considered for award.
- **DRUG TESTING PROGRAM CERTIFICATION FORM:** This form must be submitted with the bid to demonstrate that bidder has an employee drug and alcohol testing program in place and will continue to keep the program in place throughout the duration of performing the Contract awarded.

The following forms are to be executed after the Contract is awarded.

- **CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT:** This agreement is to be executed by the successful bidder.
- **PERFORMANCE AND PAYMENT BOND:** Bonds are to be executed by the successful bidder and bidder's Surety Company and submitted at the time that the Contract is executed.
- **PUBLIC WORKS WAGE CERTIFICATION FORM:** This form is to be completed in accordance with State law and submitted with every request for payment.
- **CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE:** Certificates are to be executed by the successful bidder and bidder's Insurance Companies and submitted at the time the Contract is executed.
- **OTHER BONDS:** If project is over \$100,000, CONTRACTORS AND SUBCONTRACTORS shall file a \$30,000 Public Works Bond with the Construction Contractors Board.

SCOPE OF WORK

DESCRIPTION NARRATIVE OF WORK

The contractor is required to complete all work based on the specifications below.

The Length of the project is approximately 300'. The existing width of the project is between 11' and 22'. The project will require that the road width be adjusted to approximately 24' in width to the north (18' road width, 4' gravel and 2' drainage ditch). Approximately seven trees (Two Large) and existing brush must be removed to expand the width of the road. 4' of gravel will also be placed on the south side of the finished roadway. Numerous overhanging limbs must also be removed for height clearance. The expanded width (18') will be dug out six inches below the existing road surface to allow for a solid surface. The amount of material to be removed will be determined by the bidder and priced accordingly. The expanded width roadway will be filled with 4" of 2"-3" rock and 2" of 3/4 minus rock and compacted to the level of the existing roadway. The existing roadway will be graded and crowned in the center its entire length. Compacting the entire surface is required before paving. All existing driveways and roadways will receive a four foot paved transition from the new roadway. The City is requiring at least 4" of asphalt surfacing for the new roadway the entire length or approximately 130.5 tons of #2 grade asphalt. The drainage ditch will be approximately 2' wide x1' deep.

All lengths, widths, material removal and materials are estimated. It is suggested that the contractor visits the site and takes their own measurements and calculations before submittal of their bid.

BID PROPOSAL

The undersigned, hereinafter called the bidder, declares that the only persons or parties interested in the proposal are those named herein, that the proposal is in all respects fair and without fraud, that it is made without collusion with any official or employee of the City, and that the proposal is made without any connection or collusion with any person making another proposal on the Contract.

The bidder further declares that he has carefully examined the Contract documents for the construction of the proposed improvements; that he has personally inspected the site; that he has satisfied himself as to the quantities of materials, items of equipment, and conditions of work involved, including the fact that the description of the work and materials as included herein is brief and is intended only to indicate the general nature of such items and to identify the said quantities with the detailed requirements of the Contract documents, which documents are hereby made a part of the proposal.

The bidder agrees that if this proposal is accepted, he will, within seven (7) calendar days after notification of acceptance, execute the Contract with the City in the form of a Contract provided by the City, and will, at the time of execution of the Contract, deliver to the City the performance bond and insurance certificates required by the Contract. The Contractor further agrees to the extent of his proposal, to furnish all necessary labor, equipment and tools to meet the requirements of the Contract, within seven calendar days of receiving formal written notice to proceed from the City.

The bidder further agrees to complete construction of all work in all respects as set forth in the Special Provisions and certifies that all provisions of Oregon Law (ORS 279C.840), relating to prevailing wage rates, and all other applicable provisions of ORS 279A, B and C are incorporated in and shall be complied with in making this proposal. CONTRACTOR shall ensure all employees are paid not less than the specified minimum hourly rate of wage if the project is subject to the prevailing wage rate law. Contractor certifies that it is not disqualified or debarred from entering into this contract under ORS 279B.130, 279C.440 and/or any applicable Federal compliance requirements in accordance with 2CFR part 180.

In the event the bidder is awarded the Contract and shall fail to complete the work within the time limit or extended time limit agreed upon, as more particularly set forth in the Contract documents, liquidated damages shall be paid to the City at the rate of Four Hundred dollars (\$400.00) per day until the work shall have been finished, as provided by the Contract documents. It is agreed that the said sum is a fair measure of the amount of damage the City will sustain in case the work is not completed in a timely fashion. Sundays and legal holidays shall be excluded in determining days in default.

The Bidder further proposes to accept as full payment for the work proposed herein the amount computed under the provisions of the Contract documents and based on the following unit price amounts, it being expressly understood that the unit prices are independent of the exact quantities involved, that they represent a true measure of the labor and material required to perform the work, including all allowance for overhead and profit for each type and unit of work called for in these Contract documents.

referred to as CONTRACTOR and THE CITY OF SODAVILLE, OREGON, a City
in the State of Oregon, acting by and through its Public Works Contracting Officer, hereinafter referred to as
City, mutually contract as follows:

• CONTRACTOR agrees and covenants with City that he will furnish all tools, equipment, labor and material necessary to perform and complete in a good and workmanlike manner the following work:

The widening and paying of Vine Street as described in the scope of work.	
CONTRACTOR agrees to complete the work by	

- That the advertisement for bid, the signed bid proposal, the bid unit price schedules, the bid proposal bond, the fully executed Contract, the full executed performance bond, the City of Sodaville Standard Provisions, the Oregon State highway Department Standard Specifications, the Special Provisions, and the plans are hereby referred to and by reference made a part of the Contract. All work shall be done according to the terms, conditions and requirements of said Contract Documents.
- The City agrees to pay CONTRACTOR as outlined in the attached bid proposal. Retainage shall be and amount equal to 5% of said progress payment until the work has been completed.
- This writing is intended both as the final expression of the agreement between the parties with respect to the included terms and as a complete and exclusive statement of the terms of the agreement. No modification of the agreement shall be effective unless and until it is made in writing and signed by both parties.
- CONTRACTOR shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations on nondiscrimination in employment because of race, color ancestry, national origin, religion, sex marital status, age, medical condition, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity or source of income. Contractor certifies that it is not disqualified or debarred from entering into this contract under ORS 279B.130, 279C.440 and/or any applicable Federal compliance requirements in accordance with 2 CFR part 180.
- CONFLICT OF INTEREST: CONTRACTOR covenants that it presently has no interest and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of its services. The CONTRACTOR further covenants that in the performance of this contract no person having any such interest shall be employed.
- INSURANCE: The CONTRACTOR as specified in the City of Sodaville Special Provisions and any subcontractors shall maintain insurance acceptable to the City (SECTION E) in full force and effect throughout the term of this contract. Workers' Compensation Insurance: If CONTRACTOR employs one or more workers as defined in ORS 656.027 and such workers are subject to ORS 656.001 to 656.794, CONTRACTOR shall maintain currently valid workers' compensation insurance covering all such workers, CONTRACTOR shall maintain this insurance throughout the period of this contract.
- CONTRACTOR shall abide by the provisions of ORS 279A, B and C, incorporated by this reference. It VINE STREET PAVING CONTRACT DOCUMENTS Page 12 of 22

is expressly understood that this contract in all things shall be governed by the laws of the State of Oregon.

Status of Contractor: The parties intend that CONTRACTOR, in performing the services specified in the Contract, shall act as an independent contractor and shall have the control of the wok and the manner in which it is performed. CONTRACOTR is not to be considered an agent or employee of the City and is not entitled to participate in any pension plan, Insurance bonus, or similar benefits City provides its employees.

CONTRACTOR will not be eligible for any federal social security, state worker's compensation, unemployment insurance, or Public Employees Retirement System benefits from this contract payment, except as a self-employed individual.

If this payment is to be charged against Federal funds, CONTRACTOR certifies that he is not currently employed by the Federal government and the amount charged does not exceed his normal charge for the type of service provided.

CITY will report the total amount of all payments to CONTRACTOR, including and expenses, in accordance with Federal Internal Revenue Service and State of Oregon Department of Revenue regulations. CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for any Federal or State taxes applicable to amounts paid under this contract.

The CONTRACTOR shall:

- a. Make payment promptly, as due, to all persons supplying to such CONTRACTOR labor or materials for the prosecution of the work provided for the contract.
- b. Pay all contributions or amounts due the Industrial Accident Fund incurred in the performance of this contract.
- c. Agree to protect, indemnify, and hold harmless the City of Sodaville against any and all losses, claims, or suits (including costs and Attorney fees) for or on account of injury or death of persons, damage to, or destruction of property belonging to either the City or others occurring by reason of the act or neglect of the Contractor, Contractor's employee's, or agents (including subcontractors) in connection with the performance of this contract. Agree to indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless the State of Oregon, Oregon Transportation Commission and its members, against any and all claims, actions, liabilities, damages, losses or expenses, including attorney's fees, arising from a tort, as now or hereafter defined in ORS 30.260 (Claims), to the extent such Claims are caused, or alleged to be caused by the negligent or willful acts or omissions of City's contractor or any of the officers, agents, employees or subcontractors of the contractor. It is the specific intention of the Parties that the State shall, in all instances, except to the extent Claims arise from the negligent or willful acts or omissions of State, be indemnified for all Claims caused or alleged to be caused by the contractor or subcontractor. Any such indemnification shall also provide that neither City's contractor or subcontractor nor any attorney engaged by the City's contractor and subcontractor shall defend any claim in the name of the State of Oregon or any agencies, without the prior written consent of the State of Oregon, nor purport to act as legal representative of the State of Oregon or any of its agencies, without the prior written consent of the Oregon Attorney General. The State of Oregon may, at any time at its election assume its own defense and settlement in the event that it determines that the City's contractor is prohibited from defending the State of Oregon, or that City's contractor is not adequately defending the State of Oregon's interests, or that important governmental principle is at issue or that it is in the best interest of the State of Oregon to do so. The State of Oregon reserves all rights to pursue claims it may have against City's contractor if the State of Oregon elects to

assume its own defense.

- Pay to the Department of Revenue all sums withheld from employees pursuant to ORS d. 316.167.
- e. Demonstrate that an employee drug testing program is in place and shall remain in place for the duration of this contract.
- f. Ensure that no person shall be employed for more than ten (10) hours in any one day, or forty (40) hours in any one week, except in cases of necessity, emergency, or where the public policy absolutely requires it, and in such cases, the employee shall be paid at least time and a half pay:
 - For all overtime in excess of eight (8) hours a day or forty (40) hours in any one week when the work week is five consecutive days, Monday through Friday; or
 - For all overtime in excess of ten (10) hours a day or forty (40) hours in any one week when the work week is four consecutive days, Monday through Friday; or
 - (3) For all work performed on Saturday and on legal holiday specified in ORS 279C.540
- g. If this contract is subject to the prevailing wage rate law per ORS 279C.836, and where the project is over \$100,000 the CONTRACTOR and SUBCONTRACTORS must file a \$30,000 Public Works Bond with the Construction Contractors Board to be used exclusively for unpaid wages determined to be due by BOLI, unless the project meets other exclusions identified in this section or ORS 279C.836. CONTRACTOR shall verify Public Works Bond filing for any subcontractors prior to starting work on the project.

In the event CONTRACTOR or first tier subcontractor fails, neglects or refuses to make payment to a person furnishing labor or materials in connection with this public improvement contract within 30 days after receipt of payment from City or a contractor, the CONTRACTOR or first-tier subcontractor shall owe the person the amount due plus interest charges commencing at the end of the 10-day period that payment is due under ORS 279C.580(3) and ending upon final payment, unless payment is subject to a good faith dispute as defined in ORS 279C.580. The rate of interest charged to the CONTRACTOR or first-tier subcontractor on the amount due shall equal three times the discount rate on 90-day commercial paper in effect at the Federal Reserve Bank in the Federal Reserve district that includes Oregon on the date that is 30 days after the date when payment was received from City or from the contractor, but the rate of interest shall not exceed 30 percent. The amount of interest may not be waived. If the CONTRACTOR or a subcontractor fails, neglects or refuses to make payment to a person furnishing labor or materials in connection with this contract, the person may file a complaint with the Construction Contractors Board, unless payment is subject to a good faith dispute as defined on ORS 279C.580.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

SCOPE OF PROJECT AND GENERAL INFORMATION

This project requires the CONTRACTOR to widen, grade and compact the existing road surface to ready for paving. Three inches of #2 grade asphalt will be applied after surface preparation is complete.

All driveways shall receive a four foot paved transition. Four feet of shoulder gravel will be placed on each side of the finished roadway after paving.

It is understood that this project is funded by the State of Oregon through an ODOT Small City Allotment Grant Program. Up to 50% of the funds will be available during construction. The rest will be paid upon completion and inspection by ODOT and after funds are received by the City.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS AND INFORMATION

The 2002 Oregon Standard Specifications for Construction and the January 2006 Supplemental Oregon Standard Specifications for Construction (as revised), International Building, Plumbing, Mechanical, Fire Code(s), National Electrical Code, etc. as applicable, are the Construction Specifications for this project. Other sections of the Standard Specifications may also apply and their omission as a direct reference herein does not relieve the Contractor from those standards. The cost of other items not specifically called for in the Bidder's Proposal will be considered incidental to the Project and no additional payments will be made.

The General Requirements and Information references, as provided in the Special Provisions are general in nature, those descriptions and references in the Scope of Work section are related more specifically to the particulars of the Project.

NOTE: All codes, standards, workmanship, material testing, general items, products, execution, special provisions, measurement and payments etc., are well documented in the Specifications noted above, and are NOT repeated here, but are included herein in whole or in part as reference.

Pre-Bid

A pre-bid walk through will be held at the BIDDERS convenience after prequalification and at least one week before the bid deadline. During the pre-bid walk through it is suggested that BIDDERS take their own measurements for the quantities required for the project.

The City of Sodaville reserves the right to accept all or any in part those bid items as noted in the specifications.

Payment

Payment for the various items of work shall be made at the Contract unit prices or adjusted unit prices as set forth herein. Such payment shall constitute full compensation for all labor, tools, equipment, materials, and cleanup required for a complete operating project. All incidental items of work for a complete project for which pay items do not appear shall be included in the prices bid for the various other items to which they are incidental.

No payment will be made for any materials exceeding any of the BIDDER'S estimated quantities without written approval prior to the furnishing and placement of those materials.

CITY and/or CONTRACTOR shall withhold 25% of amounts owed if certified payrolls are not submitted as required by BOLI.

Completion Date

All work shall be completed by May 30, 2021

Notification of Construction Schedule

The Contractor shall notify the City of the date construction will begin at least five (5) days prior to that date. The Contractor shall notify the City at 48 hours prior to the re-commencement of construction after any temporary work halt. In all instances residents affected by construction will be notified of the construction schedule and provided a means to gain access to their property as part of the Contractors plan. Emergency vehicles must have access to all properties at all times during construction.

Permits

Permits if required are the responsibility of the CONTRACTOR.

Traffic Control

Traffic control and protection is the sole responsibility of the Contractor and shall be in accordance with MUTCD. The contractor shall submit a signing plan prior to starting work.

The Contractor shall provide and maintain flaggers, barricades, and signs throughout the course of the project, as necessary, to warn the public at all times on right of way and easements affected by work operations.

ATTACHMENT E

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

The CONTRACTOR and its subcontractors shall maintain insurance acceptable to the City in full force and effect throughout the term of this contract.
